Breast and Cervical Cancer Control Program (BCCCP)

Appointment Line: 704-336-6500

Priority Focus:

Women who reside in Mecklenburg County

- Aged 50-64; can see limited number of women 40-49 years of age
- Cannot have private insurance, Medicare or Medicaid

Note: Must be eligible for BCCCP in order to receive free/low cost screening mammogram.

Eligibility Criteria:

- On the day of their appointment, a women needs to bring the following documents:
- Household income for themselves and any others working in the home
- Please bring your Identification care, Social Security Card
- Examples:
 - Current pay stub
 - Unemployment Statement with amount
 - Social Security statement wit amount
 - Pension statement with amount
 - Alimony Statement with amount
 - Child Support Statement with amount
 - o Food Stamp Statement with amount
 - Letter of Support with amount
- Also, if you are self-employed, we will accept the first three months of the past tax year only.
 The rest of the year, starting with April, you will need your accountants' statements with
 amount, with bank statement with amounts, your ledger with amounts or any of documents
 with amounts of your current income.

We do not accept:

Sliding Scale cards from other healthcare agencies; Medicaid or Medicare cards; or Insurance Cards

How to apply for disability

Disability through the Social Security Administration is for people who cannot work because they have a medical condition that is expected to last one year, or result in death.

While some programs give money to people with partial disability or short-term disability, Social Security does not.

To meet the earnings requirement for disability benefits you must meet two different earnings tests:

- 1- A "recent work" test based on your ages at the time you became disabled; and
- 2- A "duration of work" test to show that you worked long enough under Social Security.

There are two ways you can apply for disability benefits:

- 1- Apply online at ww.socialsecurity.gov; or
- **2-** Call **1-800-772-1213** to make an appointment to file a disability claim at your local Social Security office or set up an appointment for someone to take your claim over the phone. The disability claims interview lasts about one hour. If you are deaf or hard of hearing, you may call the free TTY number at 1-800-325-0778 between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. Monday-Friday.

To apply you will need:

- -Your social security number
- -Your birth or baptismal certificate
- -Names, addresses and phone numbers of the doctors, caseworkers, hospitals and clinics that took care of you and dates of your visits
 - -Names and dosage of all the medicine you take
- -Medical records from doctors, therapists, hospitals, clinics and caseworkers that you already have in your possession
 - -Laboratory and test results
 - -Summary of where you worked and the kind of work you did
- -Copy of your most recent W-2 Form (wage and tax statement) or, if you are self-employed, your federal tax return from the past year.



How to apply for health insurance through the Affordable Care Act

Open enrollment runs through Dec. 15, with coverage starting Jan. 1

February 15, 2015 is the **last day** to enroll for 2015 Coverage.

Most people must have health coverage (Either through private insurance or Medicaid/Medicare) or pay a fee. If you don't have coverage in 2015 you'll pay a penalty of either 2 percent of your income, or \$325 per adult (\$162.50 per child) – whichever is higher.

You're considered covered under the health care law if you have any job-based plan, any plan you bought yourself, Medicare, Medicaid, CHIP and many other kinds of coverage.

Some people will qualify for an exemption from the fee based on income or other situations.

How to Apply for Medicaid

You can apply online at: https://www.epass.nc.gov/CitizenPortal/application.do

OR

You can apply in-person at the Mecklenburg County Department of Social Services. To do so, you will need the following:

- Certified birth certificates or other proof of citizenship/alien status for each individual applying for Medicaid/NCHC
- Identity documents for each individual applying for Medicaid/NCHC
- Social security cards, social security numbers, or proof that you have made an application for a number from the Social Security Office, for each individual applying for Medicaid or NCHC
- A copy of all pay stubs for last month
- Copies of all medical or life insurance policies
- A list of all cars, trucks, motorcycles, boats, etc. you or anyone in your household own, including the year, make, model, and vehicle identification number (VIN) for each item
- Most recent bank statements
- A list of all real property you own
- Current financial statements/award letters from other sources of income, such as social security, retirement benefits, pensions, veteran benefits, and child support.

- -not have current lumps or problems with their breasts
- -have not had a mammogram in the past year
- -not have health insurance
- -live in or near Mecklenburg County
- -be a current patient of a primary care physician or clinic

Care Ring has been providing healthcare to Mecklenburg County's low-income and uninsured residents for 60 years.

- **Care Ring's Low-Cost Clinic** provides comprehensive primary care services to 2,200 uninsured and underinsured patients each year. Visits cost just \$50 for patients.
- **Physicians Reach Out**: This program provides access to comprehensive healthcare, including primary care, specialty care, labs, diagnostic tests and hospital services to 3,500 low-income, uninsured people in Mecklenburg County each year. Call the clinic to find out how to qualify for this program.
- **Nurse-family partnership**: An intensive home visitation program for first-time, low-income moms. Each mother is partnered with a registered nurse through her child's 2nd birthday. This program empowers new moms to become strong, confident parents and gain the skills and tools to provide their children a stable, healthy home and work toward their educational and career goals.
